FOUNDATION

Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club first started as an organised activity for the First Hampton Scout Group by Norm (Boss) James in 1918. The Scout Group's main theme was to promote football as a team game and encourage self-confidence, self-control and a desire to improve a player's ability. This is similar to the current philosophy used by the club today.

Initially, games were played socially against other Scout Groups and then in the Association Sub-district competition. But, as the incentive to play a higher standard became apparent, another competition was sought and in 1933, Hampton Rovers was accepted into the Metropolitan Amateur Football competition which later became the Victorian Amateur Football Association.

In 1963 the club moved from its Ludstone Street ground to the corner of David Street and Bluff Road, our present home. In 2002 this ground was formally named the "Boss James Reserve" in memory of the club's founder.

In 1979 the Hampton Rovers Football Club started its youth policy by introducing junior teams in an effort to provide an extensive link with the local community and to provide a development scheme for the senior side. Since then, 38 junior premierships have been won.

The Rovers have won nine senior premierships and were the first club to win premierships in each of the four senior VAFA sections, including the 'A' Section flag in 1951. Nine Reserve and nine Under 19 premierships have also been won by the club.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Firstly, I would like to thank Skye Hardie for her help and contribution as Junior Treasurer and Board member. I really appreciated the support she has provided myself throughout the year and has made my role alot easier.

In 2017 the club recorded a loss of \$7637.42. This was less than the previous year where the club recorded a loss of \$8,023.4. It is worth noting that there was a \$7886.45 bill owing to Sportsmart from 2016, which without would have left the club profitable in 2017.

Positives for the year included the following:

- Junior (\$34k) and senior subscriptions (\$2.3k) over performed compared to the predicted budget
- Fundraising again throughout the year was very strong. Generating \$29K from our club functions throughout the year.
- Player expenses for the year have been reduced by \$35k with the club being much more accountable on medical supplies, contract trainers, merchandise giveaways, insurance and jumpers
- The sponsorship budget was blown out of the water with some tremendous work from Troy, Steve and Co, generating an additional \$26K more than budgeted
- Canteen and Bar performed extremely well with both parties turning over a healthy profit. Bar (\$24K) Canteen (\$15K).

Negatives for the year include:

- Playing equipment was extremely high (\$25K over Budget) for the year with both the Junior and senior departments investing more money into players to ensure continual growth and success for the club
- Expensed equipment was \$4k greater than predicted

The cash position (\$119k) remains strong with the generous donation from 2015 by Peter Street's estate being kept whole. We have used some of his donation for a new electronic score board which was installed in 2017, as well as installing brand new Gym equipment for the club. The Committee continues to ensure that Peters donation will be used wisely, with a heavy focus on continual development of the club, rather than ongoing annual expenses.

I feel very positively about the financial position of the Hampton Rovers Football club and we as a committee will continue to be accountable at trying to reduce unnecessary costs that the club incurs. The scoreboard has allowed our club to become more attractive to sponsors and will continue to drive more money into the club for future years to come.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all of our sponsors throughout the year. Without them this football club cannot continue to be the success it is. I would also like to thank the Roverians for all their support throughout the year. Lastly I would like to thank the Board, Junior and Senior committees who have continued to work at ensuring the financial position of remains strong for the future. I will unfortunately be stepping down as treasurer for the Upcoming year, but will continue to support the club in any way I can. I look forward to helping my successor take over this role as smoothly as possible in the upcoming months.

JUNIOR PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Hampton Rovers Football club had a milestone year in 2017. We continued to build on the fabulous work of those that have volunteered before us. In other ways we set about establishing a new foundation for a revitalised and inclusive football club. Providing a pathway for everyone that loves footy, from Auskick through Juniors to Seniors. Joining the committee three years ago I set myself the goal of leaving Hampton Rovers in a better place than I found it. Taking on the President role in 2017 made achieving that goal even more important for me, our committee, and all of the members we look after. As I reflect on 2017, I'm proud of our club and I'm proud of all those that strive to make it a fun and great place in our community to be involved with. This year we achieved many things but most importantly of all we helped over 450 kids play a sport they love, in a safe environment with some of the best facilities in the entire league.



I could go on for days about all of the little improvements we have made that add up to make a massive difference for our members, but I will restrict myself to just calling out the highlights of the season that was 2017.

The Pathway & Club Mantra – Auskick -> Seniors. Passion, Teamwork, Fun, Respect – We introduced our club pathway and mantra in 2017 to make it clear what we are trying to achieve as a club and the values we want to live by. The kids responded fantastically to living by the mantra. Our great work with Auskick and the Seniors to provide a path resulted in 3 under 8 teams for the first time ever at Rovers, and a strengthened approach to our older age groups with our U17 of 2016 going on to play U19 football in 2017 (even fielding 2 teams). #OneRovers

Girls Footy – Whilst it's not the first year that Hampton Rovers has fielded Girls/Women's football teams, it's the most structured and driven we have been as a club for it to succeed. And succeed it did, with both of the teams having to suspend registrations early due to demand. We started the year for the juniors with our U12 Girls under lights at Boss James. What a fantastic night. All of our girls improved so much during the year and I can't wait to see them all again in 2018 with an expanded number of teams (early indications suggest 5 girls teams U12 x 2, U14, U16 and U18).

A New Website – The Juniors created its own website, Facebook page and Insta account this year with amazing feedback. Lisa Beavan (LMB Design), also a HR Mum, created it for us as well as running most of the social media for us over the year. With the increasing number of teams and need to engage a younger audience in different ways it was a great leap forward. Our social and web-presence was well recognised by the SMJFL as leading the pack and many of our new registrations came as a direct result of website. I would also like to thank all those that took the time to create content for us in 2017 – from match reports, photo's, and items for the newsletter. It was amazing to get so many people involved.

The scoreboard – Boss James is not only one of the best grounds in the SMJFL and VAFA but our facilities are ahead of so many other clubs. The introduction of the digital scoreboard at Boss James has been the pinnacle of a 3 year journey for Cam Voss and the team who start and executed this project. The scoreboard itself is a fantastic addition for our sponsors to advertise during our many games every week.

The Flags – Whilst it's definitely not about winning at HR, it's about the kids, I do love when hard work pays off. We had 3 teams this year that were lucky enough to make it to their grand finals, with all 3 winning. Congratulations to the U12 Girls, U11 D5 and U17's. A special mention must go out to our U12 Girls for winning (in their first season) the first premiership for an all girls/women's team at Hampton Rovers in our history.

Finally, I would like to round out with a few well-deserved acknowledgements to those that have helped us in 2017;

The Committee – You do a power of work, most of which is unseen and un-noticed. It has been an absolute pleasure to work with you all this year. To Troy Morris, Rich Bowen and Deb Hopkins who are stepping down from the committee – thank you on behalf of Hampton Rovers and our 450 kids and parents.



The Volunteers – Nothing works at our club without volunteers. From Coaches, to parents selling raffle tickets, you are an amazing part of the Hampton Rovers Community. Without you and others stepping forward every week and playing a part we just cannot function. I hope many of you found the roles rewarding and will volunteer again in 2018.

The Players – It's all about the kids, you are all amazing. The improvement over the year has been fantastic. I really enjoy watching you every week. See you all again in 2018 and bring your friends!!!

The League – Running the largest junior football league in Australia is no mean feat. The passion and drive from the SMJFL has been fantastic. We are all trying to do our best as a club and as a league and that will continue in 2018.

Bringing the Under 16 squads together in 2014 was one of the most satisfying experiences I have had in football ever. Stu Murray shared a vision and we are proud when watching 8 lads from that year now playing in the seniors at Rovers and it underlines how important it is to make sure we look after and nurture every child in our local community, both lads that won the 2 Under 19 B&F awards this year at Rovers were ex Zebbie players.

UNDER 17 (Div.3) – PREMIERS

It's hard to believe that just days before the first game, the call was made to withdraw the team. Only 13 boys had registered to play for the team and fewer were turning up for training. We were given 24 hours to see if we could get a few extra boys or call it quits. The results were spectacular, no doubt helped by a spectacular Autumn Day for Round 1, which combined with the pristine condition of Boss James had players registering on-line only hours before season kick off! A solid win to commence the season built the momentum, whilst strong early performances against the better rated teams confirmed that the Group would be very competitive. The disappointment of an early loss strengthened the boy's resolve, and it was this positive response to defeat which continued to attract new players into the squad.

Over the course of the season 34 players represented the team with 30 qualifying for finals. The large squad turned out to be a saviour as injuries and holidays impacted player availability, although each week we were able to get sufficient numbers to field a team, remarkably never exceeding the maximum 24 players, & twice having to take the field with only 18 running out. Probably the one win which stands out was the away game to Ormond who had inflicted our only defeat to that part of the season. Starting with only 17, we easily accounted for the opposition, showing the spirit & determination which would drive the Group to enjoy the ultimate success in the year end Grand Final.

Off field, a core group of parents worked hard to support the boys and are deserved of recognition. The Morris family got things started, helping Nick Soldatos develop as the boys Coach in the early part of the season, whilst Scott Grenda & then Andrew Pryor carried the coaching duties following Nick's departure. Cheryl Cooper put in a huge effort as Team Manager (remarkably performing the same role with the East Sandy U14s), whilst runner Scotty Glennon whose involvement with many in the Group stretches back to a decade earlier in the U9's, provided a calming on field influence across the year.

Although the team finished the year on top of the ladder, there was little between the top 4 sides, a fact proven by the closeness of the two finals. A deserved 3 point victory in the 2nd Semi Final against Waverley Park rewarded the boys with a GF spot, with Mordi Brae sneaking home in the subsequent Preliminary Final. The GF was a belter, with the boys opening up a handy 39 point half time advantage, only to see the opposition mount an incredible comeback, with the sealer kicked late in the game to secure a nail biting 10 point win. For a Group who had experienced their fair share of GF losses over recent years, the result was a fitting reward for the lads who now draw the curtain on their junior football careers. We wish them all well in their future football pursuits wherever that may be, and trust they will recall with fondness the success of the 2017 year with the East Sandy Rovers.

Overall, we had 31 players this year, with a season low of only 14 in the team and that was after 2 new recruits joined! Our team was placed in Under 16 Girls Division 2 and we had a diverse age range, with a number of players aged 12 for most of the season - a remarkable effort from these girls.

We finished the season with 6 wins, 8 losses and a draw. However, the best measure of our progress were the results against the team we played three times during the season, the Waverley Park Hawks:

We were delighted that Mike took up the position and in terms of promoting the demonstrating the HRJFC values of "Respect, Passion, Mateship and Fun", Mike has been all of that and then some.
