2018 ANNUAL REPORT

FOUNDATION

Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club first started as an organised activity for the First Hampton Scout Group by Norm (Boss) James in 1918. The Scout Group's main theme was to promote football as a team game and encourage self-confidence, self-control and a desire to improve a player's ability. This is similar to the current philosophy used by the club today.

Initially, games were played socially against other Scout Groups and then in the Association Sub-district competition. But, as the incentive to play a higher standard became apparent, another competition was sought and in 1933, Hampton Rovers was accepted into the Metropolitan Amateur Football competition which later became the Victorian Amateur Football Association.

In 1963 the club moved from its Ludstone Street ground to the corner of David Street and Bluff Road, our present home. In 2002 this ground was formally named the "Boss James Reserve" in memory of the club's founder.

In 1979 the Hampton Rovers Football Club started its youth policy by introducing junior teams in an effort to provide an extensive link with the local community and to provide a development scheme for the senior side. Since then, 44 junior premierships have been won.

The Rovers have won nine senior premierships and were the first club to win premierships in each of the four senior VAFA sections, including the 'A' Section flag in 1951. Nine Reserve and nine Under 19 premierships have also been won by the club.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Firstly, I would like to thank Skye Hardie for all her help and contribution as Junior Treasurer and Board Member her advice and support throughout the year has been superb. It has been a privilege for me to work with so many people who volunteer and contribute to the Football club to ensure it's on field success.

It was wonderful that the club had such a positive year on the field in Seniors and Juniors, unfortunately from an accounting perspective playing finals means that there is an addition month of expenses with only small revenue gains.

In 2018 after expenses of \$374,257 the club has reported a loss of \$24,688. This represents a loss of 6% on the turnover, which the club will need to ensure that we recover in 2019.

Summary of the financial results for the year.

- Auskick, Junior and Senior memberships all exceeded 2017 results reflecting increased membership and collections by \$19,500, there was no increase in the annual subscription fees in 2018.
- Revenue raised from Fundraising was stronger than in 2017 with great support from the Roverians.
- Major sponsors remained strong and in line with prior years however there was a drop off smaller sponsors (-\$20,000) which will be addressed in 2019.
- With 3 players being drafted to the AFL at the start of the year the club received talent fees of \$8,000.
- Catering and Bar income was in line with last year with the additional finals revenue offsetting the decline in sales whilst Castlefield has been redeveloped. However, expenses were higher reducing the overall profit to \$11K, down by \$12K.
- Administration and utility expenses—were all controlled and in line with 2017
- Overall playing expenses were down in line with last year, this was due to strong control of costs with \$24K being saved on playing equipment, whilst ensuring that improved first aid services were provided at all junior games(\$11K) and increased medical costs (trainers) of \$15K were incurred by the senior players partly due to the extra games played for finals.

The club is in a very sound financial position and as a committee we will continue to be accountable by reducing unnecessary costs and generating revenue to meet the ongoing annual expenses. The cash position of club remains healthy thanks to the generous donation by Peter Street's estate back in 2015. The aim of the committee is to maintain Peter's donation and not use it for operating costs. In 2019 memberships and pricing will have to be reviewed to ensure the club has a profitable year.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our sponsors throughout the year, without them the football club cannot continue to be the success it is. The Roverians have been a constant support and contribute to the club's success. The Board, Junior and Senior committees, and numerous volunteers have continued to work at ensuring that the financial position of the club remains strong for the future. It is a testament to the strength of the club that the Junior and Senior clubs work so closely together ensuring a collaborative result. Skye Hardie steps down as the Junior Treasurer and I would like to thank her again for all the support and service she has provided.

AUDITORS REPORT

To the members of Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club Inc.

Report on the Financial Report

I have reviewed the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club Inc. (the Association), which comprises the Statement of Financial Position, the Statement of Financial Performance, the Statement of Cash Flows, a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes for the financial year ended 30 September 2018.

The Committee's responsibility for the Financial Report

The Committee of the Association is responsible for the preparation of the financial report and have determined that the basis of preparation as described in Note 1(a) is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporated Reform Act 2012. The Committee's responsibility also includes such internal controls as the Committee of Management determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Reviewer's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on my review. I conducted my review in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to review engagements and plan and perform the review to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

A review involves performing procedures to obtain evidence about the amounts and disclosure in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the reviewer's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the reviewer considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design review procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but note for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. A review also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

I believe that the evidence I have obtained is sufficient to provide a basis for my opinion.

Independence

In conducting my review, I have complied with the independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

As is common for not for profit organisations, it is not practicable for the Association to maintain an effective system of internal control over income producing fundraising activities until their initial entry into its financial records. Accordingly, my review on the Association's income was limited to the amounts recorded in the financial records. I am therefore unable to express an opinion on whether the income including donations, canteen/bar takings and fundraising activities is complete.

Unqualified/Qualified Opinion

In my opinion, (except for the basis of qualification stipulated above), the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club Inc. as at 30 September 2018 and its financial performance for the year the ended in accordance with the accounting policies outlined in Note 1(a) and the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

After overcoming the disappointment of being relegated, the pleasing thing for me and the coaching panel, was the way in which all players bought into the journey of regaining our place in Prem C. With a few changes in personnel, it gave a lot of younger players opportunity to stake their claim in the senior team. The emergence of sum 15 players who either qualify for u/19s or are only a year or two out, was a huge highlight - in 2018, we officially entered a new era.

Our senior club's ability to go 7-0 was outstanding.
