

#### FOUNDATION

Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club first started as an organized activity for the First Hampton Scout Group by Norm (Boss) James in 1918. The Scout Group's main theme was to promote football as a team game and encourage self confidence, self control and a desire to improve a player's ability. This is similar to the current philosophy used by Hampton Rovers today.

Initially, games were played socially against other Scout Groups and then in the Association Sub-district competition. But, as the incentive to pay higher standard became apparent, another competition was sought and in 1933 Hampton Rovers was admitted to the Metropolitan Amateur Football competition which later became the Victorian Amateur Football Association.

In 1963 the Club changed from the Ludstone Street ground to the corner of David Street and Bluff Road, our present home.

In 1979 the Club started its youth policy by introducing junior teams in an effort to provide an extensive link with the local community and to provide a development scheme for our senior side. Since 1979 27 premierships, including two this season, have been won.

Thus, from humble beginnings, the Players, Committee and loyal Supporters have nurtured Hampton Rovers over many years and assisted in creating the strong Family Club we are today.

#### **SENIOR PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

The season got underway back in October 2000. The early arrival of Billy Campbell heralded a new focus on statistics and his tireless work throughout the year provided Norm and the team with vital information and the club with a new mate.

Pre-season saw the return of many of the regular faces that are so important to the success of any football club. The Rovers are blessed with their fair share and it did not take long for the "Light Ice Twins" Basil Guy and Graham Carr to surface. #### TREASURER'S REPORT

Season 2001 has been a dynamic year for the Hampton Rovers Football Club. It has been an exciting year with a senior flag and the confirmation that the clubroom extensions will be completed in the off-season. Personally it was a pleasure to be involved in the on field and off field success of the club.

As was the case last year Steven Helliger was the assistant treasurer and John Blangiardo worked as the club's financial advisor. I would like to thank both for their efforts throughout the year. The senior and junior committees work tirelessly to raise and collect funds and I would like to thank everyone involved.

The finances of the club are combined between the junior and senior levels, as it is difficult to split the sources of many revenues and costs. It is important that both levels continue to work together to share the resources of the club.

This year the club operated at a deficit overall, with total revenue down compared to last year. However, there were certain areas, which showed significant improvement on previous years. The deficit was a result of higher running costs along with less revenue in certain areas, particularly Raffles/Fundraising and the Kiosk. The club managed additional fundraising of over \$21,000 for the building fund (see report), making the task of fundraising directly for the club more difficult.

The financial performance of the Bar and social events was significantly better than last year. The bar turnover was well up on the last two years and the margin achieved was excellent. Congratulations to Tony Johannsen and his team for the tight management of the bar and the impressive result. Thanks also to Cameron Mcgregor for organizing social functions, vital for raising revenue over the bar. It is important the performance of the bar is maintained in 2002.

This year the running of the kiosk was tendered out to an external party (BT Event Catering) for the first time. At a glance this appears to be a failure financially. The revenue raised was disappointing for both the club and BT. However, the arrangement with BT included a \$2500 sponsorship, along with catering for the Presidents lunch (see Note # 2). Using an external party also saves our volunteers the time and pressure of running and administrating the kiosk. The arrangement is currently under review for next year.

Sponsorship revenue improved this year whilst costs remained virtually the same. Thanks to everyone who sponsors the club, the revenue raised is crucial. Thanks to Ian Lawrence who I am confident will increase sponsorship revenue again next year through the various packages made available to potential sponsors.

Subscription revenue was improved this year. Once again the juniors very successful at collecting subs early in the season, whilst the seniors need to improve in this area.

Training, medical and coaching expenses were increased this year. These areas are vital for the club to achieve our goal of becoming a successful team in the top grades. To compete we need the best medical and coaching staff available. This year we had the most professional coaches and medical staff in the clubs history and the result was the two senior sides in the grand final, a flag, and promotion to B Grade.

Overall, the performance of the club financially was reasonable given the building fund needs and the rising costs in operating a football club of this size. Revenue must be increased next year as the club strives to become more successful and provide better facilities for all players and supporters.

#### ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL REPORT TO THE CLUB'S PROFIT & LOSS STATEMENT (BUILDING FUND)

#### The Hampton Rovers Profit and Loss Statements for the last two financial years need the following footnote clarification:

Although the Club accounts show a profit of \$6,212.25 in the financial year ending 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2000, and a net loss of \$1,869.74 for the financial year ending 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2001, there are additional revenues purposely not included in both financial years. Additional funds were raised through the normal course of each football financial year that were earmarked for the future Building Fund costs, and therefore banked directly into the newly created Building Fund Account with MLC, of which the current balance, after expenses, is \$55,342.12.

A further \$34,971.90 was raised in the years preceding the last two (i.e. 1998 & 1999).

The Football Club has raised, over the last four years, in addition to its normal day-to –day operating revenue and expenditure, \$67,444.95. The Cricket Club has raised \$5,000.50 so far. Therefore, the combined funds raised is \$72,444.98, less building cost out-goings to date of \$12,064.00. This figure includes architect, surveyor and associated costs required to obtain Council's approval to the clubroom extensions.

The source of funding this football season has been from the following avenues:

- 1) Major combined football/cricket club auction night which raised a net \$14,492.76. A special committee of Junior/Senior committee/parents and cricket club committee personnel organised a very successful night.
- 2) A "Buy a Brick" program for the non self employed parents/individuals and for businesses. All funds received from individuals were sent to the Commonwealth Government "Australian Sports Foundation" who in turn pay all the funds less 5% back into our Club's building fund account. By doing this, individuals could claim a tax deduction on their contribution, in addition to the recognition of a Bronze, Silver or Gold coloured brick placed on the wall in the new clubrooms. Businesses would receive the same recognition in the form of advertising their businesses.
- 3) The final source has been the Card Game raffle in the clubrooms, where a minor proportion has gone directly to the building fund this year. The remainder indirectly would be distributed to the building fund after club profits from its normal Profit and Loss statement.

The objective for next year is to review and improve on our fund raising efforts.

In conclusion, we believe the additional revenue raised and banked in the MLC Building Fund account, over the last two years, clearly demonstrates the Club's ability to generate additional income outside of its normal day-to-day operating revenue and expense needs, to service the estimated debt level of \$150,000.00 required to complete the clubroom extensions and fitting out.
