FOUNDATION

Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club first started as an organised activity for the First Hampton Scout Group by Norm (Boss) James in 1918. The Scout Group's main theme was to promote football as a team game and encourage self-confidence, self-control and a desire to improve a player's ability. This is similar to the current philosophy used by Hampton Rovers AFC today.

Initially, games were played socially against other Scout Groups and then in the Association Sub-district competition. But, as the incentive to play a higher standard became apparent, another competition was sought and in 1933, Hampton Rovers was accepted into the Metropolitan Amateur Football competition which later became the Victorian Amateur Football Association.

In 1963 the club moved from its Ludstone Street ground to the corner of David Street and Bluff Road, our present home. In 2002 this ground was formally named the "Boss James Reserve" in memory of the club's founder.

In 1979 the Hampton Rovers AFC started its youth policy by introducing junior teams in an effort to provide an extensive link with the local community and to provide a development scheme for the senior side. Since then, 29 junior premierships have been won.

The Rovers have won nine senior premierships and were the first club to win premierships in each of the four senior VAFA sections, including the 'A' Section flag in 1951. Nine Reserve and nine Under 19 premierships have also been won by the club.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The club recorded a loss from normal trading activities for the year ended 30 September 2015 of \$10,312.92. This was lower than last year's loss of ~\$5000 and behind our budget expectations ~\$20,000.

Coaching payments were \$14,000 more than budget but somewhat offset by a \$10,000 sponsorship. The two main contributors to the underperformance to budget were junior subscriptions and fundraising; both being \$10,000 behind budget. Junior subscriptions were \$9,000 ahead of 2014 but just falling short making multiple teams in a few age groups meant we were unable to hit our budget.

Cash at bank in our trading account at the end of the year was just under \$10,000 but with a few large deposits coming in after that date the account is just \$20,000 on 23rd November.

Clubs like ours would not exist without the generous contributions of our sponsors and others in the community. This year we received a sizable contribution of \$150,000 from the estate of Peter Streat, an ex-President of the Club. This amount is in addition to the profit and cash at bank mentioned above and a subcommittee has been formed to determine how best to utilise these funds. Including these funds and the interest received from them, overall profit was \$140,632.29.

A big thankyou is also extended to all sponsors with particular acknowledgement of the major contributions provided by Buxton, Direct Connect and the Bendigo Bank Sandringham.

Trading for the year was similar to 2014 although there was again a significant investment in junior football in providing every single junior player a personalised bag, a training top and football.

Catering profit was right on budget and again much of this can be attributed to the level of effort and dedication shown by our catering manager Fiona Wilson.

I would like to thank The Board and both committees for their support during 2015. Also thanks go to Senior Treasurer, Liam Woodward, who handled all the senior payments and expenses and has enabled us to keep the finances in check.

The upcoming season provides some exciting opportunities in all areas of the club and while this is my last report as treasurer, I look forward to working with the new treasurer and seeing the club grow and continue to build on its already great reputation and success.

Independent audit report

To the members of Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club Inc

I have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose report, of Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club Inc, which comprises the Statement of Financial Position for the twelve months as at the 30th September 2014, the statement of Comprehensive Income for the twelve month period ended, and statement of cash flow for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

The Board of Managements responsibility for the financial report

The Board of Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 2(a) is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation reform Act 2012 and the needs of its members. The Board of Management's responsibility also includes such internal controls as the Board of Management determine is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on my audit. I have conducted my audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Associations preparation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Board of Management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified auditor's opinion

Expenses for coaching represents a significant expense. Contractual arrangements for most coaches are not formalised in written agreements and therefore it is difficult to establish whether all payments made are in accordance with what was expected. Accordingly, as the evidence available to me at this time is limited, my review for coaching payments has been restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. I am therefore unable to express an opinion on whether payments made are complete.

Receipts from the bar and canteen represent a significant source of revenue for the Hampton Rovers. The Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club has determined that it is impracticable to establish full control over the collection of proceeds prior to banking. Accordingly, as the evidence available to me about revenue from these sources was limited due to the impracticalities of control, my review procedures for bar and canteen revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. I therefore am unable to express an opinion on whether bar and canteen revenue obtained by the Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club is complete

Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in the "basis for Qualified auditors opinion" paragraph above, the financial report gives a true and fair view, in all material respects, the financial position of the Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club Inc as the 30th September 2015 and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the twelve months then ended on that date and complies with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 2(a).

Basis of Accounting

Without modifying my opinion, I draw attention to Note 2(a) of the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Board of Managements reporting responsibilities. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Committee

Stef coordinated the playing group and the club for our cameo appearance on a national television commercial in conjunction with the AFL Coaches Association and Chemist Warehouse to promote Men's Health Week. The club (and Buxton and Bendigo Bank) received a huge amount of exposure as a result.





A new appointment to the committee this year is **Liam Dynon**. Liam has always been on hand to assist in anyway in the past, so it was no surprise his willingness to join the committee this year. Liam has a mature head, and ensure that equal importance is placed on every player right throughout the club.

We were not fortunate enough to have **Bernie Woodland** for the entirety of the year due to overseas travel, but the work Bernie puts in behind the scenes to ensure we are well placed structurally both for today and into the future is a great help.

We are often well reminded of the Club's history and the importance of upholding a number of elements through **Max Grimmer**. Max has been a stalwart of the Rovers for many years, and his input is always well respected.

Last but by absolutely no means least to **Mr Gary Nash** and **Mr Tony Naumoff**. These two men are why the Hampton Rovers is what it is today. Their generosity, their dedication, their caring nature, their awareness of the importance clubs like ours are to the overall community, their support...I could honestly go on and on. No one would ever really know the hours these two gentlemen put on a daily basis, let alone an annual basis, other than the men themselves (and no doubt Christine and Di). The support they have both shown me during my time as president has been nothing but completely humbling. They do not get the acknowledgment or accolades they deserve for the tireless work they do. They are both such a significant reason why we have been able to enjoy our successes over the past 3 season. To you both – a very special thank you.

Board

This year saw a changing of the guard at the top, with **Gerrard Woods** taking over as Chairman of the Board. We identified Gerrard as the man for the job as he had played both Juniors and Seniors at the Rovers, he remains involved as a major sponsor and he has a great corporate governance understanding with his background in law. I would like to thank the entire Board for their support of the Senior element of the club for another year.

Coaches

I have said it before, but I will say it again, we are so blessed to have the coaches we have!

Starting with **Guy Martyn**. I approached Guy in 2012 with a bit of a dream. The dream very much centred on Guy. It is almost unheard of for a 26 year old to take on the role of Senior Coach at any level. Most 26 year olds are in the prime of their social lives, so there was an element of risk in Guy's appointment. I knew the risk, but I had no doubt in Guy's ability to understand the importance of a situation. Guy conducted himself in a way that never saw the appointment challenged. It was always going to be pretty hard to match the success the club has had over the previous two seasons, however, it could also be said – it depends how you define success.

Another pre-season rolled around using a variety of venues – Wishart Reserve, Thomas Street, St James and Boss James. We had picked up a few new recruits in Matty Robbins, Ned Fallon, Sam Bradford, Sam Macgregor and Kyle Docherty to go with the expectations that we would get full seasons from injury plagued Nath Smith and Cam Sharp. Our co-Captain, Daniel Corp, wasn't going to be in Boston for the majority of the year so things were looking good. At this stage, picking our best 22 from all available was looking like becoming a very difficult task, which is what we needed.



On a beautiful April afternoon, the season got off to a great start with a 69-point win over Mazenod who last year were pushing finals until a couple of injuries late in their season meant they finished mid table. The season couldn't have started any better but we knew we would be tested over the next few weeks.

Rounds 2 to 4 saw games against "The Big 3" (the three teams who were widely tipped at the beginning of the start of season to finish top 3). Although competitive in all three, we had losses to St Bedes/Mentone, Old Brighton and St Kevin's. It is worth noting that we were leading during the last quarter against St Bede's in round 2, were down by 20 odd points going into the last quarter with the wind against Old Brighton when the rain decided to come, and were the only team throughout the entire season (including finals) to score over 100 points against St Kevin's in Round 4. These results showed that whilst we probably weren't up to these three sides, we certainly weren't far off!

Convincing wins in rounds 5 (Parkdale Vultures) and 6 (Caulfield Grammarians) only reinforced that we were not a "fighting relegation team", but that we could push for the top 4.

The next fortnight produced arguably our most embarrassing day along with our most spirited win. To go down the way we did against Old Melbournians when we were 3-3 was a real shame. The best thing to come from it was the following week, a fighting win against AJAX which put us back level at 4-4 with one game to go before the half way mark.

We built up our round 9 game against Fitzroy, had we have won, we would've been sitting just outside the four at the half way mark. Fitzroy's results had shown us that they were around the same mark as us. By 5pm that Saturday, they were way ahead of us. I think this game is where our performance started to drop off which was due to a number of things.

Two more wins against Mazenod (round 11) and Caulfield (round 14) meant that unless there were some extraordinary results in the last four rounds, we were safe from relegation and would be playing B grade in 2016.



The aim was to try and get a couple more wins in the remaining rounds to see if we could get the win/loss ratio looking a bit better. It wasn't to be. Some disappointing results ended the season and we looked flat in plenty of them. The end of the season really couldn't come quick enough. In saying that, there were some reasons for this.

The biggest and most astounding reason is the number of players we used in the SENIORS this year – 56. This number is HUGE! It would be interesting to see the last time a team has used this many players in a single season yet managed to avoid relegation and finish 7th. Add to this the amount of games missed by key personal. The following is a list of 2014 premiership players and how many games they MISSED this year; Ting (9), Sharp (13), Verlin (16), Smith (11), Devereaux (7), Clements (6), McPherson (7), Care (13), Martyn (14), Traeger-Haig (11), Toouli (10), Schmitz (16) and Kelso (12). Add to this list, two of our recruits, Macgregor (12) and Docherty (9), and you start to see where the drop off probably came from. You simply can't have this much talent, missing this much football and still expect to be competing for finals. A positive was obviously getting games into some younger, less experienced people who will no doubt benefit from this in the coming years.

The year wasn't a success in terms of winning a premiership and/or playing finals. However, we managed to stay up in B grade and can now hopefully build on what we achieved this year and push into the top 4 next season under the guidance of Owen Lalor. I am seriously excited about the opportunity to play under him and see what he can do for this football club both on and off the field.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Hampton Rovers Football Club for the opportunity to coach the club over the last three seasons. I am extremely appreciative of the experience and memories I have had. I've learnt so much about people, footy club and obviously, coaching.
