# HAMPTON ROVERS FOOTBALL CLUB

## FOUNDATION

Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club first started as an organised activity for the First Hampton Scout Group by Norm (Boss) James in 1918. The Scout Group's main theme was to promote football as a team game and encourage self-confidence, self-control and a desire to improve a player's ability. This is similar to the current philosophy used by Hampton Rovers AFC today.

Initially, games were played socially against other Scout Groups and then in the Association Sub-district competition. But, as the incentive to play a higher standard became apparent, another competition was sought and in 1933, Hampton Rovers was accepted into the Metropolitan Amateur Football competition which later became the Victorian Amateur Football Association.

In 1963 the club moved from its Ludstone Street ground to the corner of David Street and Bluff Road, our present home. In 2002 this ground was formally named the "Boss James Reserve" in memory of the club's founder.

In 1979 the Hampton Rovers AFC started its youth policy by introducing junior teams in an effort to provide an extensive link with the local community and to provide a development scheme for the senior side. Since then, 29 junior premierships have been won.

The Rovers have won nine senior premierships and were the first club to win premierships in each of the four senior VAFA sections, including the 'A' Section flag in 1951. Nine Reserve and nine Under 19 premierships have also been won by the club.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Firstly I would like to thank Stephen Tuffley for his contribution as Junior and Board Treasurer. I really appreciated his time and guidance in taking over this role in 2016.

In 2016 the club recorded a loss of \$8,023.4. This was less than the previous year where the club recorded a loss of \$10.3k. It is worth noting that the club was unexpectedly presented a bill of \$22k by Sportsmart for merchandise and playing equipment from 2015 following an account reconciliation and \$6000 to the head of junior coaching from 2015. So after taking this into account the club in 2016 actually would have turned a profit of just over \$20,000 if only 2016 expenses & income were included.

Positives for the year included the following:

- Junior (\$9.7k) and senior subscriptions (\$2.5k) over performed compared to the predicted budget
- Fundraising brought in \$10K more than predicted with the auction night raising almost \$11k before the bar money was even taken into consideration
- Player expenses for the year have been reduced by \$35k with the club being much more accountable on medical supplies, contract trainers, merchandise giveaways, insurance and jumpers

Negatives for the year include:

- Total income for the year was down by \$20k as a result of sponsorship \$11k lower than budgeted and the canteen (\$6.5k) and bar (\$5.7k) not performing to our expectations.
- Coaching was \$6k greater than expected due to the amount owing from 2015
- As aforementioned - Equipment purchases and clothing purchased were a lot higher than predicted due to the amount owing from 2015.

The cash position (\$132k) remains strong with the generous donation from 2015 by Peter Street's estate being kept whole. We have used some of his donation for a new electronic score board which will be installed in 2017 (\$17.5k upfront payment on this years books). Committee intends to use Peter's donation wisely for development purposes rather than ongoing annual expenses.

I feel very positively about the financial position of the Hampton Rovers Football club and we as a committee will continue to be accountable at trying to reduce unnecessary costs that the club incurs. On top of this with the introduction of the women's teams to the club next year as well as a use of our new electronic scoreboard we believe we will be able draw in new sponsors and allow our club to grow stronger and stronger and ensure we can be profitable in the future.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all of our sponsors throughout the year. Without them this football club cannot continue to be the success it is. I would also like to thank the Roverians for all their support throughout the year as well as their sizeable donation given on presentation night. Lastly I would like to thank the Board, Junior and Senior committees who have continued to work at ensuring the financial position of remains strong for the future. I will remain in this position for the upcoming year and look forward to working with the new Junior treasurer.

## Independent audit report

### To the members of Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club Inc

I have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose report, of Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club Inc, which comprises the Statement of Financial Position for the twelve months as at the 30<sup>th</sup> September 2016, the statement of Comprehensive Income for the twelve month period ended, and statement of cash flow for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

### The Board of Managements responsibility for the financial report

The Board of Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 2(a) is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation reform Act 2012 and the needs of its members. The Board of Management's responsibility also includes such internal controls as the Board of Management determine is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

### Auditor's responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on my audit. I have conducted my audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Associations preparation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Board of Management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

### Basis for Qualified auditor's opinion

Expenses for coaching is a significant expense. Contractual arrangements for this year are not formalised in written agreements and therefore it is difficult to establish whether all payments made are in accordance with what was expected. Accordingly, as the evidence available to me at this time is limited, my review for coaching payments has been restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. I am therefore unable to express an opinion on whether payments made are complete.

Receipts from the bar and canteen represent a significant source of revenue for the Hampton Rovers. The Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club has determined that it is impracticable to establish full control over the collection of proceeds prior to banking. A POS system has been introduced, however the reporting from the machine has been determined to be unreliable due to user error. Accordingly, as the evidence available to me about revenue from these sources was limited due to the impracticalities of control, my review procedures for bar and canteen revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial

records. I therefore am unable to express an opinion on whether bar and canteen revenue obtained by the Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club is complete

I have not been provided with details regarding the shorts and socks sales through the Clubs supplier. On this basis I am unable to comment on the reliability of recorded sales. And whether the revenue obtained by the Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club is complete in this regard.

### Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in the "basis for Qualified auditors opinion" paragraph above, the financial report gives a true and fair view, in all material respects, the financial position of the Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club Inc as the 30<sup>th</sup> September 2016 and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the twelve months then ended on that date and complies with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 2(a).

### Basis of Accounting

Without modifying my opinion, I draw attention to Note 2(a) of the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Board of Managements reporting responsibilities. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

## DIGITAL MEDIA REPORT

2016 was another exceptional year for digital media for the Hampton Rovers Football Club. Numbers were strong across the club website and social media channels. For the 12 month period Nov 1 2015 – Oct 31 2016, the club website ([www.hamptonrovers.com.au](http://www.hamptonrovers.com.au)) was visited 51,543 times by 25,734 different people and a total of 129,135 pages were viewed. This is relatively steady in comparison to the past few years. The record day was actually post-season, on 9<sup>th</sup> September when the club announced it would be fielding a senior women's team in 2017 – this is super exciting for the club and continues to attract huge interest. The most popular pages in order were the homepage, live senior scores, juniors homepage, seniors homepage, fixtures & results.

Throughout 2016, there were 163 individual news articles posted on the Rovers website with the women's team launch taking the most-read honours, followed by the unveiling of Daniel Hughes as 2017 coach and the announcement of Christian Carnovale as 2016 U19 Big V captain.

17 videos were uploaded to the site this year, mostly match highlights, and across all videos on the Rovers YouTube channel, a total of 9,732 minutes of footage was watched in 2016 (up 5%), 4,267 views (up 33%) and 2:16 average view duration. The most popular videos were Nick Pavlou's match winner v Old Brighton, Skills Challenge at Collingwood FC and 2015 Rovers U16 GF win.

Mobile traffic continues to grow and 2016 was the first time Rovers website traffic on mobile devices exceeded desktop. 47% of users accessed the site on mobile, 41% on desktop and 12% on tablet.

The club's following on social media is large and in 2016, the club broke through 1K Facebook likes for the first time – there are now 1,117 people following the Rovers on Facebook. The reach of some of the posts has been staggering. When Nick Pavlou snapped an amazing goal from the boundary to defeat Old Brighton at their ground, a video of that goal set a record on the club's Facebook page. The post reached 17,676 individual people, it was shared 24 times and liked 559 times with 58 comments. The video was viewed 8,591 times! In addition to that, the club song reached 12K people, a photo of the players walking off the ground 4.5K times and the match report 2.6K times. After the come from behind win over Old Haileybury, the Rovers went live for the first time, allowing followers to watch the players walk off the ground, into the rooms, hear the song and Owen's post-match chat – as it happened. Facebook remains the number one engagement tool, but other social media channels are also strong. The club now has over 800 followers on Twitter and over 730 followers on Instagram.

2017 will see the introduction of the new electronic LED scoreboard at Boss James Reserve. This 4x2m screen will allow the club to promote sponsors during matches, play video and convey messages to supporters on match day. This is a big investment for the club and will prove to be a great innovation. The club also continues to promote sponsors, upcoming events and other information on the internal screens at Boss James Reserve.

All junior player subscriptions and most senior subscriptions are now paid online while payments for club membership, player sponsorship and tickets to some events are facilitated directly on the Rovers website. The weekly Rovers Newsletter continues to be popular – sent to over 1,300 people and generating plenty of traffic back to the website.

The club is lucky to have such great support and our online coverage allows people near and far to follow the club closely. I'm proud of the fact we lead the way in this regard and will continue to do so with ongoing improvements and innovation moving forward. Bring on 2017! **#gorovers**
