92nd Annual Report of the Hampton Rovers Football Club

CLUB HISTORY

Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club first started as an organised activity for the 1st Hampton Scout group in 1918. The Scout Group's main theme was to promote football as a team game and encourage self-confidence, self-control and the desire of a player to improve his ability. This is similar to the current philosophy used by Hampton Rovers today.

Initially in 1920, games were played socially against other Scout Groups. The club as we know it today was established in 1929 and as the incentive to play in a higher standard became apparent, another football competition was sought.

In 1931, Hampton Rovers was admitted to the Metropolitan Amateur Football League and played Richmond United at Burnley in its first game. The competition was renamed the Victorian Amateur Football Association (VAFA) in 1933 (a competition in which the club still participates today) and changed the colours to the current Green & Gold.

The club won the 'A Section' Premiership in 1951 and in doing so, became the first club to win flags in all four senior sections of the VAFA. In total, the club has claimed nine senior premierships including back-to-back wins in 1946-47 and 2013-14. Nine Reserve and 10 Under 19 premierships have also been won by the Rovers.

1963 saw the club move from Ludstone Street to our present home on the corner of David Street and Bluff Road. In 2002 this ground was formally named "Boss James Reserve" in memory of the club's founder.

In 1979 the club started its youth policy by introducing Junior Grades. The aims were to provide an extensive link with the local community and a development scheme and feeder base for the senior sides. The club now fields 28 junior teams in the South Metro Junior Football League, with over 600 boys and girls.

The club hosted the first VAFA Women's match in 2017, under lights at Boss James Reserve, and in 2019, fielded seven female teams, including five junior girls, U18's and senior women's.

Hampton Rovers has maintained an honest and hard-working approach to its administration and has a deeply etched tradition, not only with the VAFA and SMJFL, but with the community at large. The club also maintains a high profile with the local media.

The club celebrated its 90th year in 2019, is in a healthy position and well placed for a successful next decade as it builds towards its centenary.

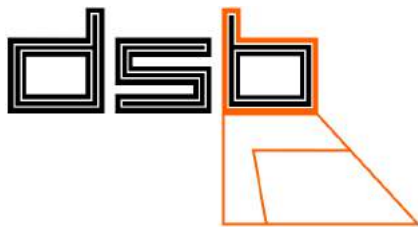

TREASURER'S REPORT

After the challenges of 2020, we were hopeful that 2021 would be a Covid normal year. Not knowing what that would look like we set a conservative budget in the hope that anything extra would be a bonus. Early registrations were promising for both seniors and juniors. Club memberships exceeded budget and our sponsors were on board.

The season commenced and it was business as usual on and off the ground. Our players, families and community continued to support the club through raffles, merchandise sales, and canteen and bar sales. Our Saturday home game lunches were operating at capacity and we even managed to enjoy a few social and fundraising activities.

The end of May saw Victoria in lockdown with the circuit breaker restrictions. We were wary at this time that things could spiral and they did. Even with the return to sport in June, we were unable to have crowds at games which meant that our canteen and bar revenue was severely impacted.

Thankfully we applied and were successful in receiving the Victorian Governments Business Costs Assistance Program. This covered our costs such as utilities, coaches and affiliation fees. It also covered the costs of food wastage from both canteens as we were unable to access either clubroom once we were "locked – down".

With gross income of \$348,387 and expenses of \$301,974, our final net profit for the year was \$46,413. This leaves the Rovers in a sound financial position, including our term deposit thanks to the generous donation by Peter Street's estate back in 2015.

We would like to thank the Junior and Senior Committees and the Board for their support. We would also like to thank our sponsors, the Roverians, members, families and players for their continued support in keeping the club in such a strong financial position. Lastly we thank John Campigli our bookkeeper, for providing us with accurate and timely financial reports throughout the year.

The Hampton Rovers Football Club is in a strong financial position moving into 2022. We are looking forward to a successful year ahead both on and off the field.

I would like to thank all of those people who volunteered, in official or unofficial roles, across all four Under 12 teams – without your amazing efforts the kids do not get to play and develop their footy and have fun with their mates.

It was evident from the outset that Hampton Rovers Under 12's had a large and very talented group of players to select a division 1 side from.

Nominating our teams for the grading games in Divisions 1, 3, 6 and 6 felt about right for the ability and experience of the group. After the four completed grading rounds, the SMJFL agreed with our assessment and left our teams in those respective divisions for the remainder of the year.

The division 1 side dominated the first four grading games and consolidated a place in that division from the outset.

It was extremely difficult to select 20 players for these initial rounds (and subsequent rounds for that matter) and it soon became abundantly clear we had a squad of around 30 players who could comfortably play division 1 on any given day and assert themselves well.

Given the nature of the rules – after 6 games in a higher division, a player can no longer play down a division – we were cautious in spreading games around to a larger squad of players so we could get a look at them over 4 or 5 games.

For a group of footballers who had not played the game together, to see the way they came together so quickly was impressive. They ran and carried the ball confidently, played on and took the game on, just like I asked them to do. They attacked, linked up across lines and worked on improving their decision making, both when they had the ball and when they didn't.

Some highlights for me were the two very close games against Beaumaris at Castlefield where it was anyone's game right until the end. The skill level on display, by both sides, was inspiring. In the end it was our composure under pressure and our relentless attack that won out. It was physical, but fair, and played in such terrific spirits.

The loss by 5 points, our only one for the season, against Ajax was incredibly valuable for our boys to show them the level of desperation required at all times to win against good teams. Teams who set themselves to play against us and give everything they have to beat us. That win meant everything to Ajax and it showed. We learned a lot.

With sides like Beaumaris, Ajax and Brighton East (although sadly we never got to play them before COVID struck) playing at a very high level in division 1, it sets up some mouth watering contests in years to come. This high level of competition in the league only serves to elevate everyone's skill level and development as we all strive to compete and outdo each other. This is great for all and I can't wait to watch all of the teams progress and improve.
