#### 4) JUNIOR PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Report also on Club Website)

Wow, what a season 2022 was for the Hampton Rovers Juniors, after the last two seasons were disrupted by COVID19 restrictions.

Despite the challenges of COVID, we still have a really strong junior program. After two years of little to no football, we couldn't have asked for a better season for the football club. This year we had close to 600 kids return to football, which allowed us to field 24 teams (6 being girls teams). 7 of those teams played off in lightning carnivals, while we had a further 300 kids experience football finals!!

In the end 15 teams played semi-finals, 8 teams went into the GF with eventually 4 winners. Congratulations to the coaching staff and players of the U11 Mixed Div 5 / U12 Girls Div 3 / U14 Girls Div 3 & U15 Boys Div 3 teams on winning the 2022 premiership.

Congratulations also to the following players who received an invitation to the SMJFL awards night and are SMJFL Best and Fairest Placegetters:

Our goal for next season is to recruit more girls and expand our girls' footy program. While we have excellent participant levels at the 12–17 year-old girls, we need to drive hard and get more girls coming through in the U8-U11 age groups. Overall, we are in a good position with a number of young ladies who have come through our junior program now playing in the senior women's team.

The Senior & Junior committees over the past 5-6 years have worked hard to formulate a one club culture. From that end, we have a number of senior players heavily committed to our junior program. This year we appointed Christian Carnovale as our Technical Coaching director. Christian has developed a program, Rovers DNA, focused on Rovers values and a way we want the kids to learn and play, this will have enormous benefits as they move through there junior footy and for those who go into seniors. We thank Christian for his involvement in our junior football program.

I'd like to also take the opportunity to thank all our volunteers who helped out on game as well as my fellow committee members. It takes a lot of help to not only get the season up and running but also but keep it on track from week to week.

#### 5) TREASURER'S REPORT (Megan McCartney & Michael Curtis)

After the challenges of 2020 and 2021, it was great to complete a full season without any Covid interruptions.

Our players, families and community continue to support the club through raffles, merchandise sales, and canteen and bar sales. Our Saturday home game lunches were operating at capacity. The seniors 2K day was well attended and once again was a successful fundraiser. Junior registrations well exceeded budget. Our budgeted sponsorship of \$40,000 was spot on.

The major fundraiser for the year was not held due to the unknown Covid restrictions. This left a deficit against budget of \$10,000. We look forward to ensuring our fundraising activities return in 2023.

Our overall net profit for the year was \$63,737, which exceeded budget by \$11,000. This surplus included \$50,000 of prepaid income from the prior year after providing our members with slightly reduced fees based on the Covid disruptions of 2021. As a result, our cash position remained similar to 2021 at \$298,000. We will review what the current term deposit rates are and consider transferring additional funds across in the new year.

This leaves the Rovers in a sound financial position, including our term deposit thanks to the generous donation by Peter Street's estate back in 2015.

We would like to thank the Junior and Senior Committees and the Board for their support. We would also like to thank our sponsors, the Roverians, members, families and players for their continued support in keeping the club in such a strong financial position. Lastly, we thank John Campigli our bookkeeper, for providing us with accurate and timely financial reports throughout the year.

The Hampton Rovers Football Club is in a strong financial position moving into 2023. We are looking forward to a successful year ahead both on and off the field.

This year saw just over 560 boys and girls register to play football with the Hampton Rovers Juniors.

Again, we had strong representation in our girl's football program with over 100 girls and young women pulling on the boots for the Hampton Rovers. We even had 6 young women across our U15 & U16 teams playing a few games for the women's seniors team!!

Overall, this allowed us to field 24 teams (5 girls teams) managed by the Hampton Rovers, plus five merge teams with East Sandringham Zebbies.

At seasons end we had 17 teams play finals. Seven went on to play in their Grand Final, with two bringing home the Premiership Flag. On top of this, we celebrated three Under 10 Lighting Carnival Premierships.

It has been an outstanding season, with a special congratulations to our Under 16 Division 2 and Under 16 Division 3 teams (East Sandy Rovers - merge teams) who celebrated with Premiership wins!

# **Treasurers Interim Report**

Another successful year for the Hampton Rovers Football Club.

Our players, families and community continue to support the club through raffles, merchandise sales, social functions and canteen and bar sales. Our Saturday home game lunches were once again operating at capacity.

Our overall net profit for the year was \$8,100, against a budgeted surplus of \$38,972. Most revenue sources were down on our budgeted expectations including sponsorship, grants and merchandise sales. Overall costs were well monitored and contained during the year.

The Rovers remain in a sound financial position, including our term deposit thanks to the generous donation by Peter Street's estate back in 2015. Our cash reserves as at 30 September 2023 are \$315,465 up from \$298,522 in 2022.

We would like to thank the Junior and Senior Committees and the Board for their support. We would also like to thank our sponsors, the Roverians, members, families and players for their continued support in keeping the club in such a strong financial position. Lastly we thank John Campigli our bookkeeper, for providing us with accurate and timely financial reports throughout the year.

The Hampton Rovers Football Club is in a strong financial position moving into 2024. There is no doubt that next year will be a challenging year financially as we undergo the clubroom renovations. However we have strong cash reserves which will cover us for a challenging 2024.
