CLUB HISTORY

Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club first started as an organised activity for the 1st Hampton Scout group in 1918. The Scout Group's main theme was to promote football as a team game and encourage self-confidence, self-control and the desire of a player to improve his ability. This is similar to the current philosophy used by Hampton Rovers today.

Initially in 1920, games were played socially against other Scout Groups. The club as we know it today was established in 1929 and as the incentive to play in a higher standard became apparent, another football competition was sought.

In 1931, Hampton Rovers was admitted to the Metropolitan Amateur Football League and played Richmond United at Burnley in its first game. The competition was renamed the Victorian Amateur Football Association (VAFA) in 1933 (a competition in which the club still participates today) and changed the colours to the current Green & Gold.

The club won the 'A Section' Premiership in 1951 and in doing so, became the first club to win flags in all four senior sections of the VAFA. In total, the club has claimed nine senior premierships including back-to-back wins in 1946-47 and 2013-14. Nine Reserve, 10 Under 19 and one Senior Women's premiership has also been won by the Rovers.

1963 saw the club move from Ludstone Street to our present home on the corner of David Street and Bluff Road. In 2002 this ground was formally named "Boss James Reserve" in memory of the club's founder.

In 1979 the club started its youth policy by introducing Junior Grades. The aims were to provide an extensive link with the local community and a development scheme and feeder base for the senior sides. The club now fields more than 25 junior teams in the South Metro Junior Football League, with over 500 boys and girls playing for the Rovers.

The club hosted the first VAFA Women's match in 2017, under lights at Boss James Reserve, and in 2022, fielded six female teams, including five junior girls teams and the senior women's team.

Hampton Rovers has maintained an honest and hard-working approach to its administration and has a deeply etched tradition, not only with the VAFA and SMJFL, but with the community at large.

The club celebrated its 90th year in 2019, is in a healthy position and well placed for a successful decade as it builds towards its centenary.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Another successful year for the Hampton Rovers Football Club.

Our players, families and community continue to support the club through raffles, merchandise sales, social functions and canteen and bar sales. Our Saturday home game lunches were once again operating at capacity.

Our overall net profit for the year was \$8,100, against a budgeted surplus of \$38,972. Most revenue sources were down on our budgeted expectations including sponsorship, grants and merchandise sales. Overall costs were well monitored and contained during the year.

The Rovers remain in a sound financial position, including our term deposit thanks to the generous donation by Peter Streat's estate back in 2015. Our cash reserves as at 30 September 2023 are \$315,465 up from \$298,522 in 2022.

We would like to thank the Junior and Senior Committees and the Board for their support. We would also like to thank our sponsors, the Roverians, members, families and players for their continued support in keeping the club in such a strong financial position. Lastly we thank John Campigli our bookkeeper, for providing us with accurate and timely financial reports throughout the year.

The Hampton Rovers Football Club is in a strong financial position moving into 2024. There is no doubt that next year will be a challenging year financially as we undergo the clubroom renovations. However, we have strong cash reserves which will cover us for a challenging 2024.

2023 started off as most seasons do, full of excitement and hope for success come seasons end. While the season ladder did not represent that, I have to say I am quite proud of all the playing group and how it all unfolded.

The seasons challenges with injuries and plenty chasing the European summer saw us looking deeper for players and many others getting an opportunity that otherwise would generally be overlooked. The improvement of players and dedication to stick by the club to ensure we always managed to field a side no matter how hard the games prior were, was amazing. The season saw us have 71 different individuals don the Rovers jumper in the reserves alone, 48 of which polled votes in the best and fairest count.

From a skills perspective, we introduced 3 key points of focus for each 'third' of the ground being DEF, MID and FWD so the boys had 3 basic skills to remember based on where they were playing at that time, most pleasingly, was that after 3-4 rounds, all boys could recite back the key points for each third without prompt, and, started to coach each other on the ground as to what they needed to do, or how they needed to set-up – absolute confirmation that the players understanding of the game and commitment was improving each week.

I have no doubt that these players are ready and able for the full ground format next year.
